Their success depended on their ability to innovate, find creative solutions and collaborate. Through period artifacts and stories, young participants will take on challenges inspired by the world of travel and navigation, past and present.

History and Memory – Guided tour with a Museum mediator

Through this exhibition spanning over five centuries of history, visitors will explore navigation tools and themes related to transportation and travel.

The Story Factory – Participatory workshop

Considering the challenges of today's world, participants will create a prototype of the vehicle of the future.

Ahoy, **Mateys!** – Collaborative games

Students become deckhands for a day as they embark on fun collaborative games and take on challenges that will help them navigate their ship across the ocean.
